6th Grade – Course Descriptions

Intro to Coding:

This introductory computer coding course empowers students to create and engage with computer technology. Students learn to problem solve through several challenges with real world scenarios. Students create their own animations and programs using Code.org. This course is designed to be creative, engaging, collaborative, exploratory, and fun!

Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Design & Modeling:

This Project Lead the Way class is a hands-on learning and activity course designed to enrich students' understanding of Technology and Engineering and allows them to TOUCH science and math. Students will be introduced to what technology and engineering actually are as they research different career paths that could lead to future jobs. They will learn the art of measuring and sketching using state of the art 3D computer software that will provide a great foundation for CADD software knowledge. A wood project done completely in the wood's lab will give the students the opportunity to use numerous tools and machines. Lastly, the students will get a taste of automation and robotics as they learn to build and program Lego Mindstorms robots. World Languages and Cultures:

Students learn about the language and culture in countries where German and Spanish are spoken. They also receive a brief introduction to Chinese. The cultural topics will include geography, holidays, currency, and family life. In addition, students will acquire basic vocabulary in Spanish and German, (polite expressions, colors, and numbers). This class can help students decide which language to study in future grades.

Exploring Music:

The Exploring Music portion of the exploratory block of classes is a nine-week course for students <u>not enrolled</u> in Band, Orchestra or Choir. The focus of this class is to experience the many different facets of music and to apply that knowledge into everyday living. Students will explore music fundamentals, musical theater, ukulele, world music and music technology.

Choir:

Choir members learn about their own unique instrument - their voice. Vocal training will emphasize musical skill development through learning songs in many different styles, languages, and time periods. The fundamentals of reading music and sight singing will be a part of the overall choir curriculum.

Band:

Sixth Grade Band is a class where students have the instruction to learn how to play a band instrument and perform for others. The class helps all students develop the necessary skills for playing a band instrument. A week-long summer lesson program occurs in August for students to get a good foundation before the school year begins. The band meets daily and each student is expected to receive a weekly lesson. Performances include "Bands of the Falls" a winter and spring concert along with other small group opportunities.

Orchestra:

Sixth grade beginning orchestra is open to any student who wants to develop the necessary skills to play a string instrument (violin, viola, cello, bass). No prior experience is necessary. A week-long summer lesson program occurs in August for students to get a good foundation before the school year begins. The orchestra meets daily and each student is expected to receive a lesson weekly. Performances include the annual winter and spring concerts, Stringfest, and participation in a solo recital.
